

Moonlight Walk 2026

Terms and Conditions



1. The Moonlight Walk is organised by and is for the benefit of Hospice at Home West Cumbria (HHWC).
2. All participants must be aged 8 and above. Any participants under the age of 18 **must be accompanied by a responsible adult** at all times, with the name and contact details of the responsible adult provided upon registration.
3. If you are unable to attend the event, please inform HHWC as soon as possible. Your place is not transferrable or refundable.
4. By taking part in the event you are committing to raising funds for the charity. All adult participants (over the age of 18) must raise a minimum of £35 sponsorship to be donated to HHWC. All sponsorship money must be handed to HHWC by **Friday 16th October 2026**. If you are collecting sponsorship monies on behalf of a group, please list all participants names when handing the money to HHWC.
5. An early bird ticket price will be available for all entries registered on or before Tuesday 30th June 2026. Any entries completed after this date will be subject to our standard ticket pricing, which is available to view on our website.
6. For your safety and enjoyment of the event we ask that you follow and adhere to the instructions given by the organisers and volunteer marshals. Please do not walk on roads or disrupt the normal flow of traffic, and please make use of official crossings when available. **For your own safety and that of others, you must walk on pavements at all times.**
7. Each participant is responsible for their own safety, and that of any children they are declared responsible for.
8. We request that participants **do not consume alcohol** whilst taking part in this event as the law regarding consumption of alcohol on public highways will be contravened. Breach of this law may submit HHWC to legal action. If you choose to consume alcohol during the event or arrive under the influence of alcohol or recreational drugs, you will no longer be the responsibility of HHWC, and will be refused permission to take part in this event.

9. Walking a distance of five kilometres is considered a light physical activity. However, participants should ensure they are fit enough to take part. If you are unsure about your fitness levels or have any health concerns, please consult your GP before participating.
10. The organisation can not be held responsible for any loss and/or damage of personal effects, or any personal accident.
11. Participants are not permitted to start walking until the event has officially started. The walk is not a race, and we kindly ask you to stay behind the lead walker and in front of the back walker, who will be made known to you before starting the walk.
12. We ask participants to be considerate when walking through residential areas and to keep noise to a minimum.
13. If you are unable to complete the walk in full you must inform a member of HHWC staff or a volunteer/marshal. If any of your group have been collected prior to informing a member of HHWC staff or a volunteer/marshal, please inform as soon as possible.
14. By taking part in the Moonlight Walk, you are giving permission to HHWC and its sponsors to use photographs, recordings, data and any other record of your participation for legitimate purposes without remuneration, unless stated otherwise in our media consent declaration upon registration. Those who have not agreed to media consent will be provided with a wristband that must be on show at all times during the walk.
15. Participants are responsible for their own travel to and from the event. The starting and finishing point is J Edgar & Son Hyundai, Dunmail Park, Workington, CA14 1NQ. Free parking will be available in Dunmail Park car park.
16. Any participants that have not returned to the finishing point by 12am are no longer the responsibility of HHWC, and there will be no HHWC personnel in attendance after this time.
17. Should alterations to the planned activity be necessary to ensure the safety of our participants, the organisers will give prior notice as soon as is reasonably possible, before the event or upon arrival.
18. Please be prepared to use a torch for any dimly lit areas on the route, by providing your own headtorch, phone torch, or hand torch for your personal use.
19. Well behaved dogs are welcome at the event, however these must be on a lead at all times. If you choose to have your dog on an extendable lead, we ask that this is always fixed at 1 metre. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs.
