Some differences might be:




Age

If someone is a man, a woman or transgender.

Transgender is when a person feels they are in the wrong gender body for them.



Married

If someone is married or in a civil partnership.



Pregnant

If someone is pregnant or has just had a baby.



Race and Nationality

People who come from different places, have different skin colours or have passports from different countries.



Religion

What faith a person has.



Sexuality

If a person is gay, lesbian or bisexual. Lesbians are women who are attracted to other women. Gay men are attracted to other men. Bisexual people are attracted to women and to men.
